SATAN

I. WHO IS HE?

A. Mark 4:15; Luke 8:12; Mathew 13:19

He is variously referred to as "Satan", "the devil", and "the wicked one".

B. Mathew 4:1-3

Another appropriate monicker for the devil is "the tempter".

C. Revelation 20:2; Genesis 3:1-4, 13-15

He is "the dragon" and "that serpent of old", referring to man's first sin.

D. John 8:44

The devil is the father of lies and the original murderer.

E. Luke 11:15-18

Satan has been called "Beelzebub, the ruler of the demons".

1. 2nd Kings 1:2-3

This epithet derives from the Philistines' idol "Baal-Zebub, the god of Ekron", literally translated as "Lord of the Flies" or "Lord of the Dung". By the first century, Jews had co-opted the name of an obscure idol of their long-vanquished enemies to represent Satan himself.

2. 1st Corinthians 10:19-21; Psalm 106:35-38

Demons are idols.

a. 1st Chronicles 16:25-26

Idols are gods.

b. Psalm 115:3-8

Idols do not exist until men create them.

c. Satan rules over these false gods.

II. WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

A. Colossians 1:16

He is not self-existent, but was brought into being by the Creator who is Christ, and he was made for Christ, although he no longer serves Him.

B. Jude 6

Some angels have rebelled against God; perhaps Satan was among them.

C. Revelation 12:7-9

The angels who fight against the archangel do so under the devil's command.

D. Job 1:6; 2:1

Satan presents himself before Jehovah alongside the "sons of God".

1. Romans 8:14

The phrase has differing applications based on context. In some cases, the term "sons of God" means those who are led by the Holy Spirit.

2. Luke 20:36

When the righteous dead inherit the resurrection, they are "sons of God", being "equal to the angels".

3. **Job 38:4-7**

Elsewhere in the book of Job, the "sons of God" who rejoiced at Creation could only have been the angels of heaven. Therefore, the "sons of God" beside whom Satan stood were angels.

4. Psalm 115:3; Job 1:7; 2:2

Since "God is in heaven", and Satan left earth to present himself before Him, we are further grounded in our conclusion that, in this specific case, the "sons of God" are angels.

5. In all likelihood, Satan retains the nature of the angels, being a spirit.

III. Where Does He Function?

A. Job 1:7; 2:2

He roams the earth.

B. 1st John 5:18-19; John 12:31; 14:30; 16:11

Holding sway over the "whole world", he is called the "ruler of this world".

C. Revelation 20:10

He is not lord of hell. Rather, hell was created by God to punish the devil.
