The unlawful taking of human life demands a reckoning. After ridding the earth of the corruption of violence in a worldwide deluge (Genesis 6:5-13), God told the survivors, Noah and his family, "Whoever sheds man's blood, by man shall his blood be shed; for in the image of God, He made man" (Genesis 9:6). No other creature is worthy of vengeance.

No man is justified cursing another man. One must exercise control over his own words, as it is written, "No man can tame the tongue. It is an unruly evil, full of deadly poison. With it we bless our God and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in the similitude of God. Out of the same mouth proceed blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not to be so" (James 3:8-10).

Man's place in the world is superior to animal life. "God said, 'Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth' So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them" (Genesis 1:26-27). Because man was made in God's image, but animals were not, animals are subject to man's dominion.

This is not to suggest animals deserve abuse from mankind, for "A righteous man regards the life of his animal, but the tender mercies of the wicked are cruel" (Proverbs 12:10). Animals ought to receive kindness and cruelty should not be tolerated. Thus, God, through Moses, commanded Israel, "You shall not muzzle an ox while it treads out the grain" (Deuteronomy 25:4). Yet, even in this, the Lord intends a deeper application about one's regard for his fellow man. Paul, defending his apostleship to the Corinthians, wrote, "It is written in the law of Moses. You shall not muzzle an ox while it treads out the grain.' Is it oxen God is concerned about? Or does He say it altogether for our sakes? For our sakes, no doubt, this is written... Even so the Lord has commanded that those who preach the gospel should live from the gospel" (1st Corinthians 9:9-10, 14). The proper treatment of animals is about learning the proper treatment of humanity because humanity is superior to animals inasmuch as humanity bears the image and likeness of God.

### "THE WHOLE WORLD LIES UNDER THE SWAY OF THE WICKED ONE"

The last vestiges of public decency are now being displayed when politicians and celebrities acknowledge the foundational fact of biology that men are men, women are women, and none can change their gender. This is true. "He created them male and female, and blessed them and called them Mankind in the day they were created" (Genesis 5:2). Moral people applaud the courage of public figures willing to state the obvious about transgenderism. And that is how low modern society has sunk.

The debate over transgenderism has taken the heat away from the issue of homosexuality. Not that long ago, Bible believers were still pressing the fact that, among other sinners, neither "homosexuals, nor sodomites... will inherit the kingdom of God" (1st Corinthians 6:9-11). Very few are vocal about this any longer, as it requires great boldness just to say a man cannot be a woman.

Before homosexuality was so widely accepted, the hot topic for moral discussions was promiscuity because "Marriage is honorable among all, and the bed undefiled; but fornicators and adulterers God will judge" (Hebrews 13:4). Now, though, seemingly decent people will either overlook fornication, or even flaunt it themselves, while condemning homosexuality and transgenderism.

Prior to the broad cultural acceptance of sexual immorality, there was a general concern about serial monogamy in the form of divorce and subsequent marriage. Jesus preached, "Whoever divorces his wife, except for sexual immorality, and marries another, commits adultery; and whoever marries her who is divorced commits adultery" (Matthew 19:9). Concern about divorce gave way to concern about pre-marital sex, which was followed by widespread acceptance of homosexuality, and now the fight is on about switching genders.

Acknowledging these cultural failures is not a matter of pining after a bygone era of moral uprightness, for there never was such a time (Ecclesiastes 7:10). Rather, the point is that one moral outrage replaces another because the world at large is corrupt. "The whole world lies under the sway of the wicked one" (1st John 5:19). God's people must live in defiance of social custom, loyally adhering to His moral standards, and never yielding to the devil.
